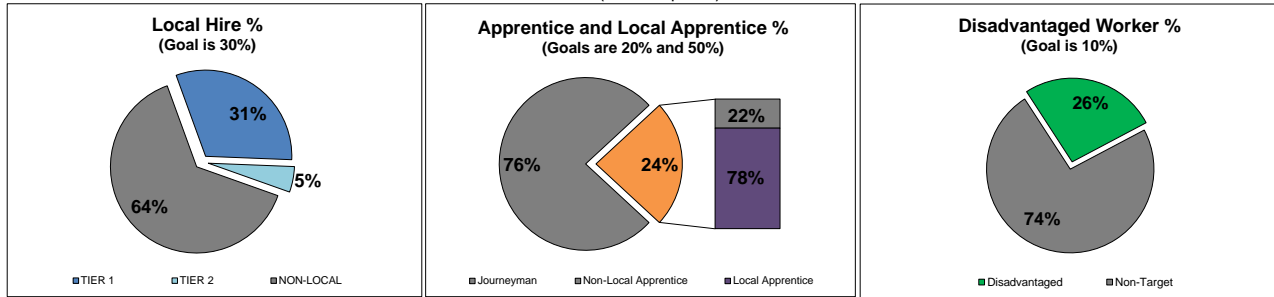

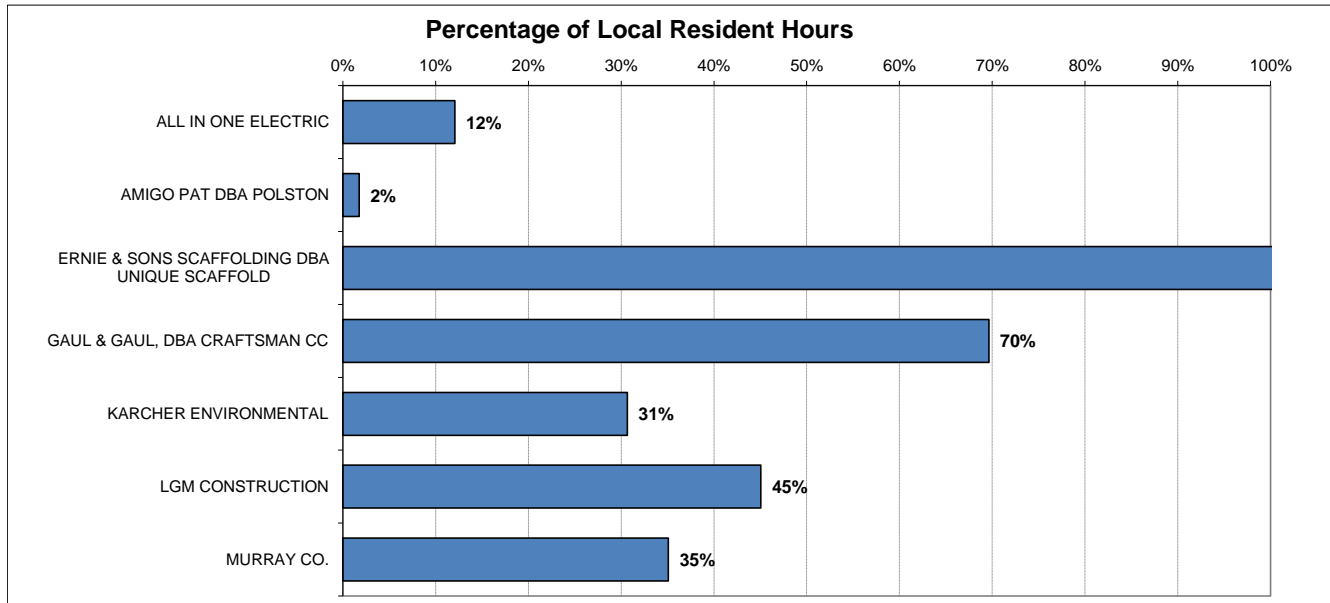

(b) faces at least one of the following barriers to employment: being homeless, receiving public assistance, lacking a GED or high school diploma, having a history of involvement with the justice system, being a single parent, or suffering from chronic unemployment or underemployment.

**Local Apprenticeship:** Work hours performed by an apprentice who is indentured in a bona fide Labor/Management construction apprenticeship program, registered and approved by the State of California Department of Industrial Relations or Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS) and whose primary place of residence is within Tier 1 or 2 zip code areas.

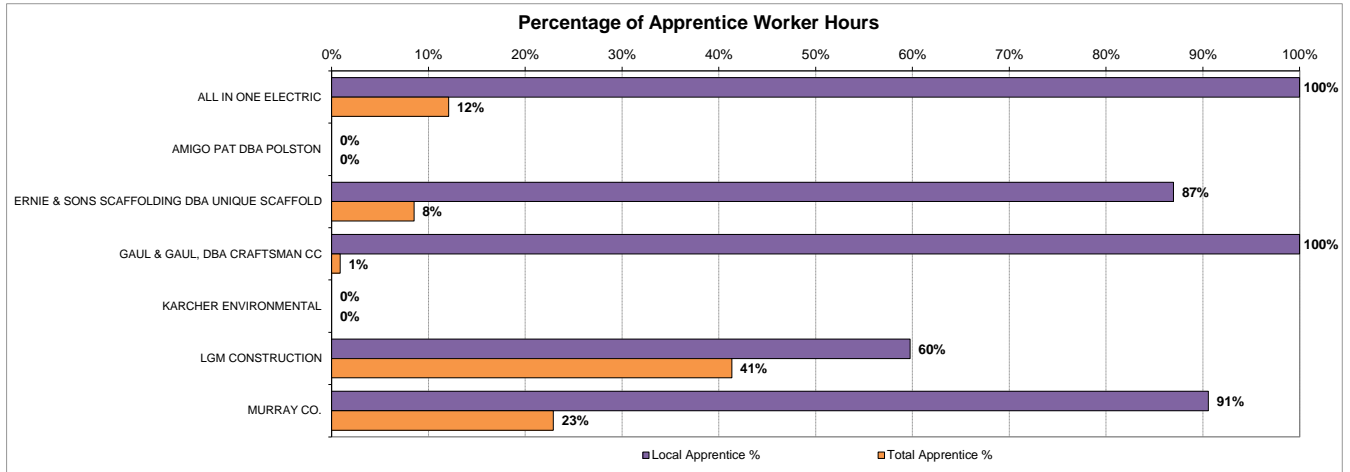

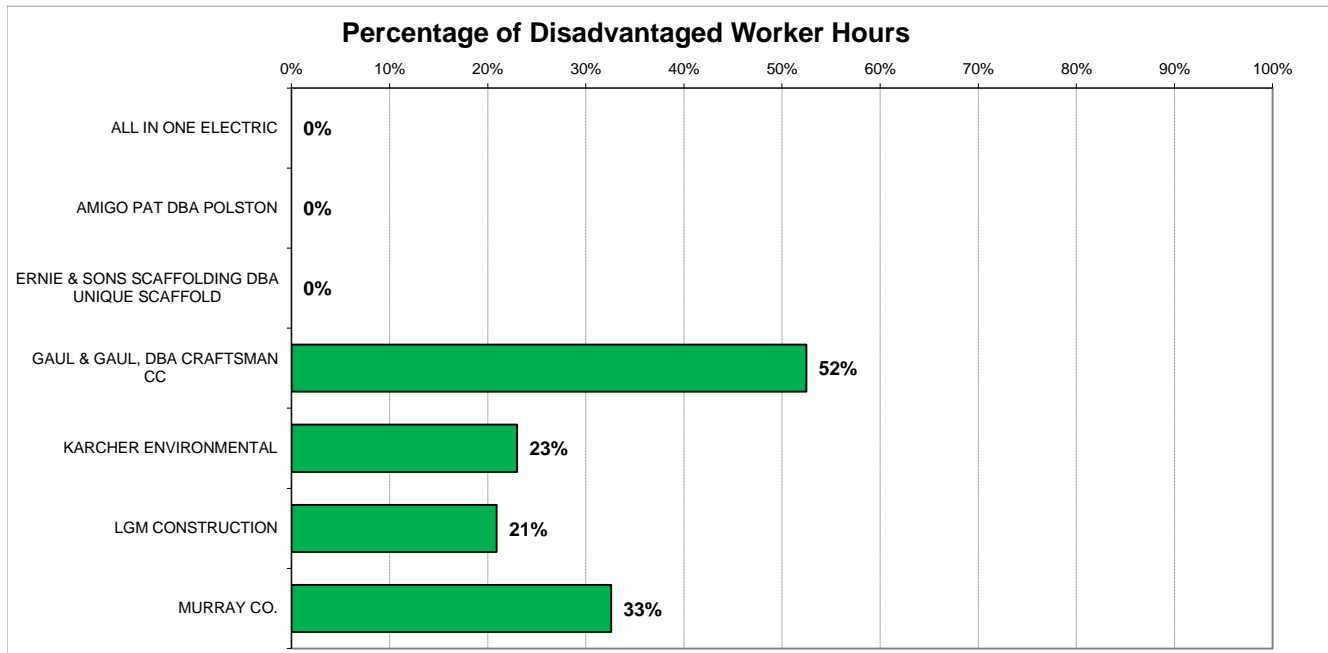
